CHICAGO FIRST US CITY TO BAN BPA

The City of Chicago became the first US City to ban the use of Bisphenol A (BPA) in containers designed to be filled with food or liquid for children under the age of three. The new law will take effect on January 31, 2010.

On 28 May, 2009, the City of Chicago in the state of Illinois approved the ban on bisphenol-A in containers for children under the age of three ¹. Chicago became the third jurisdiction in the US, following Suffolk County in Long Island, New York ², and the state of Minnesota ³, to ban the

use of BPA in containers for children.

The new law will be enforced by the department of business affairs and consumer protection. Retailers are required to post signs in stores to notify customers that containers for sale in the store do not contain BPA. Any person in violation shall be fined USD 100-300 for the first offense and USD 300-500 for each subsequent offence. In addition to civil penalties, the permit, license or certificate of operation may be suspended or revoked. Summary of the new law is highlighted in the Table below.
